2009 LUNCHEON HONORS RVGS VOLUNTEERS

A large gathering of RVGS members and guests met at the Knights of Columbus Hall for an excellent luncheon held Dec. 19th to honor the volunteers of our society and library. Vern Arnold installed the elected Board Officers for the 2010 year and pictured left to right they are: Connie Miller, Vice President; Andrea Patterson, Secretary; Charleen Brown, President; Colista Bailey, Treasurer; and Marie Fulbright, Trustee.



Chuck Eccleston, Volunteer Coordinator, provided the yearly statistics. 82 volunteers were recognized for contributing 13,100 hours in 2009. This is an average of over 1,000 per month and an equivalent of one hour for each 13,000 bound volumes in the collection. 48 volunteers contributed up to 100 hours per month, 10 up to 200, 5 up to 300, 7 up to 400, 4 up to 500, 2 up to 600, 4 up to 700, and 2 over 700 hours (Barbara Basden & Gene Henry). Of the total 13,100 hours, 40% (5,175) were contributed by Board members.

She manages the microfilm/microfiche orders and has set up Jackson County cemetery information files and compiled a reference book of all these cemeteries with the assistance of Chuck Eccleston. She is a member of Friends of the Jacksonville Historic Cemetery and places flags for each military veteran in the cemetery. Betty has also done research on these veterans (over 340) from the War of 1812 to the Vietnam War.

She began doing research in 1961 when she saw a friend’s pedigree charts with a queen! She now has her *own queen* and a lot of “common people” with amazing and amusing histories. Researching her “Smith line” may take her to the Salt Lake Library four times a year rather than her usual three trips!

She is also a Life Member of the Conejo Valley Genealogical Society of Thousand Oaks, California.

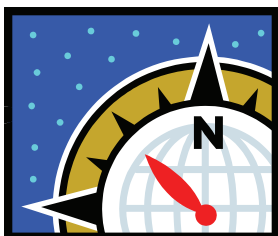

Annual Report

In January 2009, the RVGS Board conducted its annual evaluation of the 5-year Goals established in 2004. It was determined that due to the changing needs of our Library and Society, a new 5-year strategic plan was needed. New goals were established as follows:

Goal # 1 Develop and implement a marketing plan to improve the professional image of RVGS in Jackson County.

To meet goal # 1, a calendar of events and activities to promote RVGS was created, a budget for advertizing was established, brochures and stationery were redesigned, a successful Genealogy Week was conducted with a variety of well attended mini-classes and a new "Writing Contest" was implemented to encourage community participation. The *Between Us Diggers* and the *Rogue Digger* publications were updated and published on the Society website. We joined Ashland, Phoenix and Medford Chambers of Commerce and participated in Community Outreach through the Antique Show, a reception at the Red Lion, and presentations for DAR, Lake Creek Historical Society, Rogue Valley Manor, Rotary, Senior Aces, and SOHS.

Goal #2 Expand Library services for volunteer staff and patrons.

To expand Library services, we have implemented new classes, mentoring, "helping hands" for one-on-one research help and training on how to use technology in researching. Librarians have received training in sending research material via email, Board members and volunteers have received training in the use of new technology and communication continues to improve through the utilization of the website and email.

Goal # 3 Develop an annual and long-range financial plan sufficient to achieve future financial stability.

To meet Goal # 3, the Board determined that since it is estimated that our current building capacity will be reached by 2015, a Capital Campaign was established to meet the probable need for expansion or relocation. A Facility Planning Committee has been established to study opportunities for expansion, relocation and/or a shared facility. Life and Life Benefactor memberships were established to increase the Endowment Fund which will provide future financial stability.

Goal # 4 Expand membership through recruitment and retention.

To continue to expand membership as outlined in Goal #4, it was determined that the dues reminder process has been successful and should be continued. Membership as of January 2010 was 463 individuals, an increase of 47 since January 2009.

Goal # 5 Develop a plan to enhance the collection through technology to add value to our services, increase efficiency and effectiveness and provide compatible technology services that support our mission, are cost-justified, and are easy to use and support.

To meet Goal #5, Resource Mate software was purchased to computerize the library catalog. Volunteers have input nearly all of the books in the collection into this database for eventual publication online. Two websites have been established to better serve members and patrons: Jackson County Genealogy Library, www.rvgslibrary.org, receives an average of 3,250 hits per day. It provides local records through indexes and databases which are now available electronically. A Jackson County Historic Cemetery Directory has been developed and all past volumes of *The Rogue Digger* have been scanned and indexes are being made available online. The Rogue Valley Genealogical Society site, www.rvgsociety.org, receives an average of 400 hits per day and provides information and news about the Society.

Goal # 6 Provide professional and functional facilities that support our goals for volunteer staff and patrons.

To provide a professional & functional facility, remodeling upstairs provided additional workstations and the completion of the bookcase project provided needed space for the collection. The outside of the building was repainted for improved curb appeal.

Goal # 7 Annually evaluate circumstances and capabilities and adjust management and operations to assure ability to meet established strategic goals.

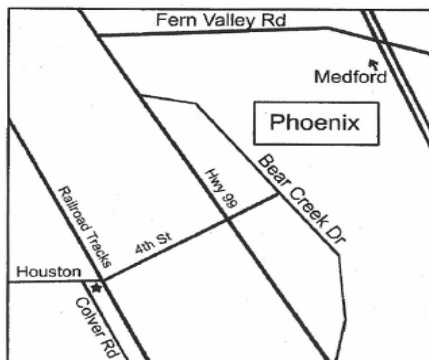

Directions to the Library

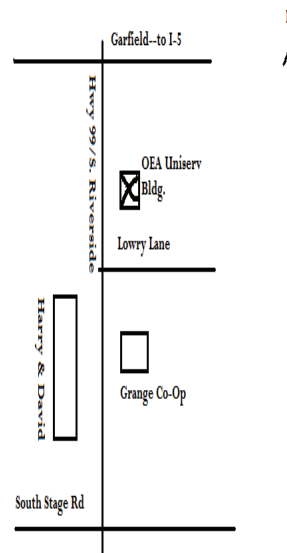
