**Description:** Commemorating the 150th Anniversary of the start of the Civil War. Expert Russ Kautz will present "Civil War Strategy and Leadership." Mr. Kautz, is a West Point graduate and a local businessman who will offer his perspective regarding the strategy and leadership of the Civil War. Russ was born and raised in Medford, enlisted in the Army right out of high school, and was offered an appointment to West Point after attending the United States Military Academy Preparatory School. He graduated from West Point in 1982 with a BS with an area of concentration in Western European History. He was selected to become a Foreign Area Officer of the Soviet Union and spent one year at the Defense Language Institute and one year at the Naval Postgraduate School, both in Monterey, CA, to earn a masters degree in National Security Affairs. After 13 years on active duty as an Airborne Ranger Infantry Officer he took a voluntary separation from the Army, since all of the combat arms officers in his Russian Institute class were passed over for promotion to Major. This was right after the Berlin Wall came down, and the need for Soviet Union Foreign Area Officers was greatly diminished. Russ moved back to Medford and started a career as a Financial Consultant. He also joined the Oregon Army National Guard and is now a retired Lieutenant Colonel. He currently is an independent Certified Financial Planning Professional with over 17 years in the financial services industry and is a volunteer West Point Admissions Coordinator for Greg Walden's Congressional District. His love for the Civil War period began when he was in junior high school. FREE

GenealogyBank's archive contains five different collections of materials for family history research: Historical Newspapers, Historical Books, Historical Documents and Recent Newspaper Obituaries and the Social Security Death Index.

#### **Historical Family History Records**

<u>Historical Newspapers (1680-2007)</u> features over 300 years of fully-searchable historical newspapers printed in small towns and big cities throughout the U.S.


<u>Historical Books (1801–1900)</u> include hard-to-find printed items such as family genealogies, local histories, funeral sermons and biographies.

<u>Historical Documents (1789-1984)</u> include military records, causality lists, Revolutionary and Civil War pension requests, widow's claims, orphan petitions, land grants and much more.

### **Recent Family History Records**

Newspaper Obituaries (1977 to current) and free access to the up-to-date Social Security Index.

Newspapers are added on a regular basis. Come to the library and check out this valuable site .

#### DR. STEPHEN MORSE, PH.D.

Dr. Stephen Morse is a computer professional with a doctoral degree in electrical engineering from New York University. He is best known as the architect of the Intel 8086 (the granddaddy of today's Pentium processor).

Besides working in the fields of research, product development and teaching, he holds four patents and has written four textbooks and many technical papers.

Several years ago in the course of doing his own web-based genealogy research, Dr. Morse developed the One-Step searching aids on which the Saturday seminar is based. At the Friday evening workshop, he will draw from his scientific knowledge to present genetic genealogy concepts in an easy-to-understand manner.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**


Annual dues are \$30 for an individual and \$15 for each additional member of the same household. This includes library checkout privileges.

#### **Directions to the Library**


