## WE ARE GOING TO VISIT SALT LAKE CITY

**APRIL 8 - 15** 

The 2013 RVGS-Raindance bus trip to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City is scheduled for Monday April 8 through Monday April 15 and seats are still available! We will spend Monday in Winnemucca and will arrive in Salt Lake City around 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday. We will have Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and a full day on Saturday for


research. We will leave on Sunday morning and spend Sunday night in Winnemucca, arriving back in Medford on Monday afternoon.

Rhonda at Raindance Tours has the itinerary ready. The fare includes all baggage handling and although the modern and comfortable bus has its own bathroom, the trip includes frequent stops along the way to stretch or to grab a cup of coffee.

We will stay at the Salt Lake Plaza Best Western Hotel, which is just a few steps from the Family History Library and adjacent to Temple Square. The free downtown light-rail (TRAX) runs right by the hotel's front door and connects you to many of SLC's best attractions. The cost of this trip will be \$850 per person for double occupancy if 20 or more participate. Single occupancy will be \$1,175. The price will be adjusted if fewer than 20 sign up. Be sure to call Rhonda at 541-479-8217 to reserve your spot and sign up on the list at the Jackson County Genealogy Library (JCGL) or call (541)512-2340 and provide your email address so that we can keep you informed about the full itinerary. There will be a pre-trip-meeting at the JCGL to help you plan ahead and use your research time wisely.

By now you have heard about, read about, seen a picture of, or visited the exciting new location of our Jackson County Genealogy Library at 3405 South Pacific Hwy., Medford, OR. We are all very pleased with the new building and the expanded services we are able to provide in this larger facility. These expanded services include the following:

- ♦ More patron computers
- A large reading room
- ♦ Laptop usage areas
- ♦ A mentoring service area
- ♦ Larger classroom, more classes
- ♦ Expanded meeting area
- ♦ Events in our own building
- ♦ And last but not least, plenty of parking



Member contributions to the Annual and Building Fund Drives have made this move possible and we thank each and every one who donated so generously. However, this is just the beginning, because we still need the support of our membership to pay off the mortgage. Our other building is for sale and we have had some interest but as you know the real estate market is slow so selling it may take some time. In the meantime, we are faced with mortgage payments on the new building. We can do this, but we need your help.

That is why we are inviting ALL members to join our annual "5/60 Club." What is that? It is very simple! If each member would contribute as little as an additional \$5 per month or \$60 per year, the funds would reduce the mortgage considerably. For example, 500 members (we have over 600) each donating \$5 monthly or \$60 annually would generate \$30,000. This would easily make the mortgage payments (\$1,600 per month) as well as reduce the principle by approximately \$10,000.

So, we are asking each member, even if you have already donated, to join our club and make a tax-deductible donation for 2013. It will make a big difference in paying off the mortgage.



# LIFE MEMBERS ELLEN BRANNICK AND CAROL BROCKFIELD

In the 1960s, Carol reconnected with her father and then moved on to use genealogical research to reconstruct the history of both sides of her family. This predated the LDS Church's creation of online record databases and Ancestry.com. Genealogical research then required going to the county courthouse to read and delve into records, and Carol's ancestors were in Pennsylvania. The trail next led into Poland, from which her maternal grandparents had emigrated.

As Ellen became intrigued by Carol's research, she allowed herself to be dragged to the genealogical library in Napa, CA, where—blessed with luck—she found her family immediately. In the Iowa book section was a county history describing her father's family back to her great-great-grandfather and telling of his life in early America. After much diligent work she now has found family back before the Mayflower, while Carol is still stuck in the 17th century.

They both think that JCGL is basic to anyone's hunt for their past. It offers classes in research, reliable source books, helpful volunteers and free access to internet sites. ## WARREN BROWN AND CHARLEEN BROWN

Charleeen's story: My first experience with family history came when I was about 14 years old and traveled by train with my grandmother to a Moore Family Reunion in Pixley, CA. I was too young to appreciate all she did at the time but she saved documents, letters and family heirlooms and I am proud to have many of those artifacts today. However, this early interest was put on hold when Warren Brown and I married in 1960 and spent the next 35 years making a home and raising our family. It wasn't until after retirement in 1993, that my interest was rekindled.

One day I was driving through Medford on South Central when I happened to see a sign that said GENEALOGY at 133 S. Central Ave. Remembering my early interest, I drove around the block and parked in front of the building. Strangely enough it was a Tuesday and the sign on the door said that the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society was closed on Tuesday. Disappointed, I vowed that the next time I was in Medford, not on a Tuesday, I would definitely try again. Just over a week later, I walked in, took the tour and immediately signed up to be a librarian. One week after that, I took the library training and was scheduled to be a volunteer librarian once a week. That was in 1995. My interest continued to grow and by 1996, I was working on the obituary project as well as being a librarian. In 1998, I was elected Secretary of the Board and by 1999, I was elected Vice President. I became President in 2000 when the elected President resigned. The rest is history.

Warren was always interested in hearing about my genealogy research but not in researching himself. He became a member of RVGS in 2003 when the society purchased the building at 95 Houston Road and we became co-signers on the mortgage. Having more of an interest in woodworking than research, he contributed by building 66 bookcases for the new library expansion project. In 2012, when the society purchased the building at 3405 S. Pacific Highway, he built 17 more matching bookcases for the new library space. We became life members of RVGS because we want to continue to support the Society's goal of preserving the past for the future.

#### **2012 ANNUAL REPORT**

The year 2012 will go into RVGS history as a milestone year for the library. By now everyone knows that we purchased and remodeled the building at 3405 S. Pacific Hwy., Medford, OR. When we signed the papers in March, our 5-year goals had to be altered to include the extensive remodeling of the building in keeping with Goal 6 below, to provide a professional and functional facility. This took most of the year, but we are proud of the result.

We started by contracting to have the asbestos removed. This was necessary for the safety of our volunteers and patrons. We had a new roof put on, and volunteers began the arduous tasks of interior demolition. We had an architect who helped with the planning of the interior. Volunteers did a lot of tearing out, cleaning up, and hauling of debris. While some worked inside, others worked outside painting and gardening. The outside looked great with new paint, a new roof and fresh landscaping. The inside took much longer. All the floor coverings and tile had to be removed, new walls and partitions needed to be built, and a beam needed to be replaced to open up two large rooms. The electrical, plumbing, insulating, heating and cooling were contracted out and had to be completed before interior paint could be done. When new floor coverings were installed, we were ready for the big library move. We had a deadline of September 21, 2012, for our "Grand Opening" and **WE MADE IT!** More than 300 people attended the festivities to see our beautiful new library. We are very pleased with the results even though it was a bigger job than first anticipated. The remodeling expenses have all been paid, so now we can concentrate on paying down the mortgage. The continued support of member donors is very important in meeting this financial obligation. Although much energy was expended on the new building, we still managed to meet many of our goals:

#### Goal 1 Develop and implement a marketing plan to improve the professional image of RVGS in Jackson County.

- We purchased new signs along Hwy. 99 to identify our location.
- We changed name of the library to Jackson County Genealogy Library for better identification.

#### Goal 2 Expand library services for volunteer staff and patrons.

• We conducted a five-week series of genealogy classes through Southern Oregon University and for patrons.

#### Goal 3 Develop an annual and long range financial plan sufficient to achieve future financial stability.

- We purchased and remodeled a building to house the Jackson County Genealogy Library.
- We continued classes and other income-producing activities and fundraisers.

#### Goal 4 Expand membership through recruitment and retention.

- We continued to develop procedures for and implemented phone call reminders for new members.
- Our new location increased our visibility, so usage increased.
- Over 300 attended the "Grand Opening" and 84 attended the Christmas Party.

### Goal 5 Develop a plan to enhance the collection through technology to add value to our services, increase efficiency and effectiveness, and provide compatible technology services that support our mission, are cost justified, and are easy to use and support.

- We combined circulating and research books in the collection for better usage.
- We continued to keep our technology equipment and software current.

#### Goal 6 Provide professional and functional facilities that support our goals for volunteer staff and patrons.

• We met this through the purchase of new building. See remodeling described above.

### Goal 7 Annually evaluate circumstances and capabilities and adjust management and operations to assure ability to meet established strategic goals.

Board Retreat was held in November to evaluate and adjust long-range goals.

As an all volunteer organization, RVGS is proud of our dedicated volunteers who devote many, many hours of service. The total number of hours for 2012 was **19,057!** Using an average value estimate of \$21.36 per hour, the volunteer worth was \$407,050 to our organization. This is astounding.!!! However, there is another aspect to add to the value



of this volunteer work. If you ask those patrons who were treated with a beautifully remodeled building and then were helped to break through that "brick wall" and find a long-lost relative, their answer would be "**PRICELESS**." Thank you volunteers, we couldn't succeed without you.


