Historic Jacksonville's Christmas Tour

Did you know that the Christmas tree is a German tradition introduced to England by Prince Albert in 1841? Or that the first Christmas card was sent in the 1840s? Or that Charles Dickens may have had more influence on the way we celebrate Christmas than any other single individual? Celebrate Christmas with the Beekman Family and learn more.

1863 BANK IS OPEN IN DECEMBER.

Step behind the counter of the oldest bank in the Pacific Northwest when Historic Jacksonville, Inc. opens the Beekman Bank Museum from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. during the first three weekends in December as part of Jacksonville's Victorian Christmas celebration. Cornelius Beekman came to Jacksonville in 1853 as an express rider carrying gold, mail, and news over the Siskiyou between Jacksonville and Yreka, California, where prospectors and settlers filed mining and land claims. When he opened Beekman's Express in 1856, he also bought a safe and established a gold dust office, the first "bank" in the Oregon Territory (what is now Oregon, Washington, and parts of Idaho and Montana.) Both an entrepreneur and public servant, Beekman became one of Southern Oregon's wealthiest and most prominent pioneers. The current bank building, constructed in 1863, has been preserved intact as a museum since Beekman's death in 1915. Visitors are invited to see the gold scales, peer in drawers, and step inside the vault while costumed docents share stories about Beekman, pioneer life, and 19th Century banking practices. The Beekman Bank is located at 110 W. California Street at the corner of N. 3rd Street in Jacksonville. Admission is free; a \$3 donation is suggested to help maintain the Bank and keep it open to the public. For additional information, contact 541-245-3650 or info@historicjacksonville.org.

The Society and Library have consolidated our strengths, planned for the future, and continued to grow! The most visible achievement is the addition of our acoustical-quality accordion doors, which allow us to hold two meetings, programs, classes, etc. simultaneously...a matter of importance as we added the Genetic Genealogy Interest Group and the Jewish Interest Group to our panoply of interests: Beginning Genealogy, Advanced Genealogy, Irish, German, and Family Tree Maker. We invite the formation of more interest groups, as we continue to grow our membership from 769 to 814. The acoustical accordion doors were partially funded by a grant from the Jackson County Cultural Coalition, thanks to our grantwriter, Barbara MacMillen.

"Gateway to Germany" with Warren Bittner was a smashing success as our 2017 Seminar. Our excellent monthly public programs and Quilts and Genealogy Talks are drawing larger audiences (also thanks to Pam Sasseen, our Publicity Director), and we are now on track to offer at least one class most months. These programs are now being videorecorded as part of "Stories of Southern Oregon" and will soon be available on CD and the Internet. Genealogy Week was very well attended, with several new classes and instructors, and a new beginning genealogy class series kicking off the week on Saturday. We continue to offer an OLLI (Osher Lifelong Learning Institute) Beginning Genealogy course each fall, and this year had our largest attendance ever, at 34. Many attendees became RVGS members.

Two new programs were tried in the summer months: "Genealogy for Kids," partnering with the Boys and Girls Club in Talent, and a "Let's Learn About It" series about our subscription websites on Tuesday evenings.

The Silent Auction of heirloom quilt tops and blocks brought us over \$500. We received two exceptionally large genealogy library donations, have added many wonderful books to the library collection, and held a Surplus Book Sale that netted us \$1,514. Two of our members have volunteered to sell books for us on Amazon (after our members have a chance at them at JCGL!)

We dropped our subscription to Newspapers.com (too expensive) and added HistoryGeo.com. We also added a link to the free Daughters of the American Revolution website.

What does all of this mean? We are a strong, fiscally responsible, thriving, all-volunteer organization. 82 active volunteers have given us a total of 11,849 volunteer hours from January through October 31. We are flourishing, and will continue to flourish as we update our five-year strategic plan and find ways to keep pace with future developments. We are especially looking forward to the launch of our new website in 2018. Congratulations: this is YOUR organization, and you are keeping it healthy...through your suggestions, your contributions, and your volunteering.

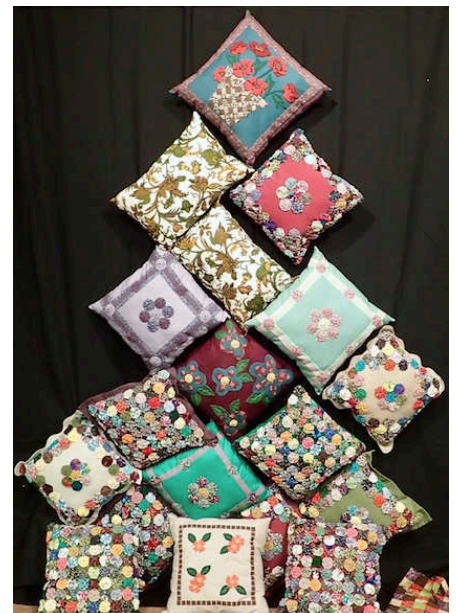

WE ARE A FamilySearch AFFILIATE LIBRARY.

RVGS has been a Family Affiliate Library with familysearch.org for quite a few years. Until this September, this status entitled our members to rent microfilm from the vast collection at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City and have it sent here for viewing and printing. The microfilm rental program was discontinued in September, because the entire collection of microfilm will be digitized by 2020 and because the program was expensive to operate. NOW, by registering for a free account with familysearch.org, you can view many digitized records from any computer...but not ALL records. Some digitized records may only be viewed AT the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. SOME may be viewed at a Family History Center (there is one in Central Point, one in Grants Pass, and one in Medford). SOME may be viewed at either a Family History Center OR a Family Affiliate Library. So, if you are accessing familysearch.org at home, and you receive a message that the image you wish to view may only be viewed at a FamilySearch affiliate library or a family history center, remember **JCGL IS A FAMILYSEARCH AFFILIATE LIBRARY and we are open 41 hours a week!**

RVGS AT THE RAILROAD SHOW

Over Thanksgiving weekend RVGS set up a booth at the Rogue Valley Railroad Show at Jackson County Expo. Our exhibit with storyboards and the attractive railroad quilt drew people in. Our volunteers explained the research and educational opportunities available at our library and provided handouts. This was an opportunity to meet people, hear their family stories, and point out the advantages of joining RVGS.



SPOTLIGHT ON HISTORIC CEMETERY PRESERVATION

Volunteers of the Jackson County Genealogy Library (JCGL) became aware that records of many unknown or forgotten burial sites were not represented in the library's massive cemetery records collection. Efforts are now underway to add to the records collection. This is the second article in a series describing newly discovered cemeteries and burial sites throughout the county.

DUNKARD CEMETERY

Drivers on South Highway 99 just north of its intersection with Colver Road are unaware they are passing the site of the Church of the Brethren and its abutting cemetery established in 1890. The property was subsequently subdivided with the front parcel zoned for commercial use and the rear cemetery parcel remaining as a cemetery under the ownership of the Brethren Church. The Church, with its headquarters in Washington State, has been gone for many years. Fortunately its historic cemetery honoring the remains of many pioneer families survives. Headstones read: Bacon, Brower, Bush, Clevenger, Crawford, Crum, Firestone, Hanscom, Hankins, Lamb, Mason, Mast, Minear, Mow, Netherland, Nininger, Rhodes, Rogers, Settles, Spencer, Spitzer, and Springer.

Those pioneers rest here in a well maintained setting thanks to years of care and maintenance by various family members, many loyal volunteers, and, most recently, Carl Shauger, a member of RVGS and its JCGL Cemetery Committee. Carl volunteered under the direction of Judith Minear Stanford, a Minear descendant and President of the Friends of the Talent Church of the Brethren Cemetery. Mr. Shauger and Mrs. Stanford publish a quarterly magazine pertaining to the families buried in the cemetery. Copies are available at JCGL. The cemetery is currently maintained by volunteers of the Ashland Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 353.

In 2015 an Oregon Historic Cemetery Commission Grant funded a property line survey and map. The survey determined the actual cemetery boundaries are beyond the fenced portion of the cemetery, leading to discovery of additional burials outside the fenced area. Dowsing rods determined a total of 243 unmarked graves. The total number of known graves in the cemetery increased to 285. A copy of the map is on file at JCGL.



A flagpole was erected on cemetery grounds by a local Boy Scout Troop as an Eagle Scout project. The flagpole with an American flag on display can be seen from Colver Road.

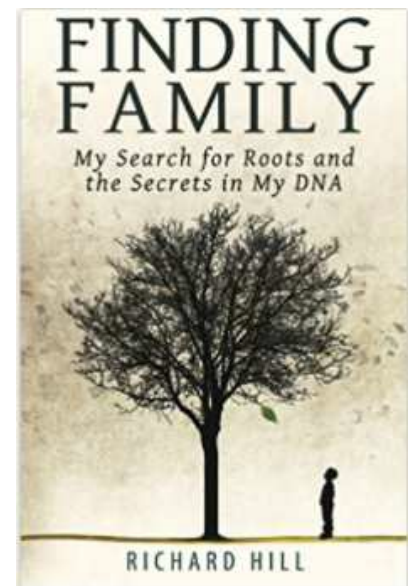

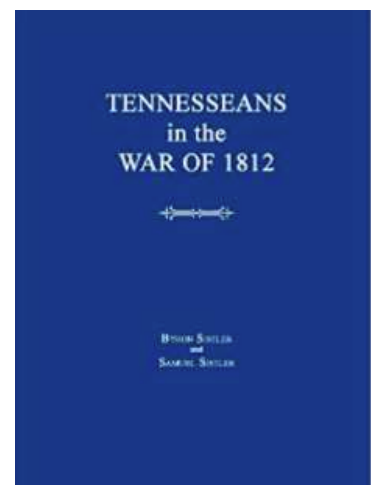

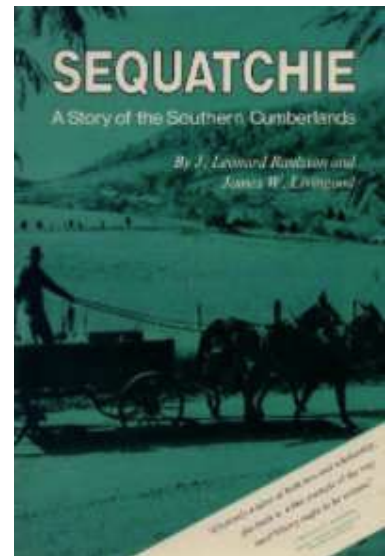
